Class of 2010 Bachelor's Degree Recipients Alumni Survey Summary

Background

In spring 2011, the Office of Institutional Research (OIR) conducted a one-year follow-up survey of the 1,843 alumni who received a Bachelors' degree in fiscal year 2010.¹ The purpose of this survey was to assess graduates' perceptions of their UMBC experience and gather feedback on post-UMBC activities.

Survey Methodology and Administration

OIR developed a paper survey based on questions mandated by the Maryland Higher Education Commission (MHEC). Alumni Relations and the Alumni database provided addresses for the mailing of the surveys. Of the 1,843 alumni, 1,816 had viable addresses and were eligible for the survey.² A lottery for graduates who completed the survey by the deadline was implemented in conjunction with three mailings as a strategy to increase participation.³ This strategy yielded a response rate of 21% (1,816 eligible, 384 completers).

Characteristics of Respondents

For comparisons by program area, those graduating in Interdisciplinary Studies are listed but not included because of their small number (n=<7).

- Three hundred eighty four (384) of the 1,843 responded to the graduate follow-up survey (21%). (Table 1a)
- Female graduate respondents were over-represented, constituting 49% of degree recipients and 57% of respondents (Table 1a)
- Asians and African-Americans were slightly under-represented, while Whites were over-represented. (Table 1b)
- Respondents who matriculated as new freshmen were more likely to respond than those who matriculated as transfer students. (Table 1c)
- Those in Engineering and Information Technology were slightly under-represented, while those in the College of Arts, Humanities and Social Science disciplines were slightly over-represented. However, this effect by discipline is most likely attributable to gender differences in enrollment and the gendered response rate. (Table 1d)

Residency

- Ninety percent reported being a legal resident of Maryland at the time of enrollment. However, after graduating, 30 of the 347 (9%) initial Maryland residents indicated they were now out-of-state. Forty-nine percent of initial out-of-state residents chose to stay in Maryland after graduating. (Table 2)

² Of the 1,843 alumni, 27 surveys were undeliverable. The foreign addresses were omitted from the study; there was no way to account for return postage from international addresses resulting in an under-representation of International students.

³ As a strategy to increase participation and an incentive to complete the survey, a lottery for a \$100 Amazon gift certificate was offered to students who completed the survey.

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Graduate School

- After completing a program at UMBC, 168 of the respondents enrolled in school again (44%). (Table 3a)
Of these, 64% were female. (Table 3b)
- Alumni from CNMS and SOWK were most likely to re-enroll (70% and 69% respectively). (Table 3c)
- Of those respondents who re-enrolled, 79% were pursuing a graduate degree or higher. This translates to an overall 35% of respondents pursuing graduate level education or higher. (Table 3d)
- Females were more likely than males to pursue a graduate level degree. (Table 3e)
- College of Arts, Humanities and Social Science (CAHSS) respondents made up the greatest portion of those re-enrolled (51%). (Table 3f) However, they make up 57% of the total respondents.
- Overall, 83% reported majoring in the same or related field when they re-enrolled. Engineering and Information Science alumni had the highest re-enrollment in the same or related major (94%). (Table 3g)
- Ninety percent indicated UMBC preparation for graduate or professional study to be “good” or “excellent”. (Table 3h)
- Eighty-six percent of those respondents who re-enrolled in school again reported having Maryland as their current residence. (Table 3i)

Major

- Seventy-one percent of respondents reported that if they were able to do it over again, they would definitely or probably major in the same field. Seventy-eight percent of Engineering and Information Technology alumni indicated that they would major in the same field. (Table 4)

Employment

- Fifty-eight percent of all respondents reported working full-time. (Table 5)
- COEIT alumni reported the highest percentage working full-time (82%). (Table 5a)
- Seventy-seven percent of respondents working full-time reported working in Maryland. (Table 5b)
- Of all respondents reporting working full-time, 21% described their current occupation to be Information Systems professionals. (Table 5c)
- Seventy-four percent of all respondents who reported working full-time reported their current occupation to be “directly” or “somewhat” related to their major. (Table 5d) Among the colleges, COEIT had the highest percentage (89%). (Table 5e)
- The median salary band of those employed full-time is \$40,000 to \$44,999. (Table 5f)
- Most COEIT alumni earned \$55,000 or more. (Table 5g)

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- Overall, males reported earning a median salary of \$45,000 to \$49,999, compared to \$35,000 to \$39,000 for females. (Table 5g)
- Of the 251 respondents who indicated that they did not re-enroll in graduate school again, 87% reported working full or part-time. Thirteen percent reported not being employed, and 2% indicated not seeking employment. (Table 5h)
- Eighty-two percent of graduate school enrollees who were working (full or part-time) reported working in Maryland. (Table 5i)

Satisfaction

- Eight-two percent of respondents stated that if they had it to do over again, they would definitely or probably attend UMBC. (Table 6)
